



ARIZONA STATE FORESTRY DIVISION EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Current Fire Activity

Sunday July 8, 2012 0800
(Report covers previous 24 hours)

Statewide Weather Brief: A relatively dry and stable air mass will remain across Arizona and will limit showers today and Monday. Expect scattered showers and thunderstorms over eastern portions of the state with only isolated showers elsewhere. Temperatures will remain near or slightly above normal. Minimum relative humidity of 10 to 15 percent can be expected in the lower elevations with 15 to 20 percent across the higher terrain.


