Current Fire Activity

Friday July 6, 2012 0800
(Report covers previous 24 hours)

Statewide Weather Brief: Temperatures will increase today and Saturday bringing us up to seasonal averages. Afternoon humidity levels will fall into the lower teens in most areas. Showers and thunderstorms should remain mostly in Southeast Arizona. Outside of thunderstorm activity winds should generally be light with the typical diurnal patterns.


