Current Fire Activity

June 23, 2013 0800 hrs

National Preparedness Level: 3
Southwest Area: 4 Arizona Forestry: 4

Statewide Weather Brief: Red Flag Warning in effect from 10 am to 8 pm this evening for strong winds and low relative humidities in Mohave County. There is an upper level low over the region which will cause Arizona to see sustained winds of 15-20 mph today through Tuesday. Tomorrow, most of northern Arizona is expected to reach Red Flag Warning thresholds. Dry conditions will prevail into the middle of the week with a strong warming trend.

Arizona Dispatch Center (ADC) Activity: ADC dispatched resources to 3 wildfires. Resources continue to be dispatched to the Creek, Doce, and Rock Creek fires. Resources have been dispatched to Colorado, New Mexico, and Utah.


