Current Fire Activity

National Preparedness Level: 3
Southwest Area: 4 Arizona Forestry: 4

Statewide Weather Brief: Record high temperatures are expected through the weekend. Low relative humidities will continue with poor overnight recoveries and winds will be light. Dry thunderstorms are expected Friday through Monday in the higher terrains of eastern Arizona.

Arizona Dispatch Center (ADC) Activity: ADC dispatched resources to 1 wildfire and 3 smoke checks. ADC transferred 2 wildfire reports to Flagstaff Dispatch. Resources have been dispatched to Colorado and New Mexico.


